High school grads receive \$462,000 towards post-secondary education

Nanaimo, 16 June 2014 – This month, hundreds of local graduating high school students from Nanaimo Ladysmith Public Schools (SD #68) received a total of \$462,000 in scholarships, bursaries and awards from the Nanaimo-Ladysmith Schools Foundation to pursue post-secondary education.

Overall, 372 students were awarded amounts ranging from \$100 to \$5,000 each.

Erin van Steen, executive director of the foundation, said that local service clubs, community organizations and private donors provided \$322,000, while the Ministry of Education funded 140 scholarships of \$1,000 each. Last year, the foundation distributed \$450,000 to local graduates toward the cost of post-secondary education.

"Thanks to the generosity of our donors, many graduating high school students now have the opportunity to continue their education," said van Steen. "Our donors understand the importance of helping young people succeed and see their support as an investment in their community's future. Without our donors' financial support, many students may not have the opportunity to go to college or university."

van Steen credits the \$12,000 increase in funding to a new initiative - a 50/50 draw payroll contribution program for school district employees to help raise funds for scholarships. Last year, the foundation received a license for the program. VIU has operated a similar program for over 18 years.
